



Geoff Clarke Memorial Scholarship Before You Apply

Overview:

This yearly scholarship was established as a memorial to the late Geoff Clarke, a youth worker at the Ministry of Children and Families in Powell River B.C. Geoff was known for going above and beyond his duties to help kids and his legacy for youth will live on through the hearts of those who knew him.

Geoff was passionate about helping youth succeed and strive to reach their potential. He encouraged post-secondary education to many of the youth he worked with. This scholarship is intended **but not exclusively** for youth who have had services from the Ministry of Children and Families in Powell River, B.C. for at least two years who wish to further their education.

Geoff's post-secondary training was in the area of Recreation Management and his passion for the outdoors was always in the forefront of his work with youth in the community. Geoff who was a school trustee for many years was instrumental in seeing the school district #47, Brooks Coast Mountain Academy Program (previously known as BOATT) become a reality.

It is for this reason that candidates who are intending to pursue a career in the areas of recreation leadership, environmental studies and or outdoor adventure tourism are eligible to apply.

 - Assigned a social worker or child protection worker,

 - Lived under MCFD sanctioned independent living arrangement or Youth Agreement.
- 6. Intend to pursue Recreation Leadership, or Adventure Based Tourism or Environmental Studies in a college or university.


