In PIE, we have a number of program options, depending on your geographical location within the province of BC.

These include both home-based learning and in-person opportunities.



INDIGENOUS EDUCATION

Indigenous students in PIE are supported by our Indigenous Education Department which includes a District Principal of Indigenous Education, an Indigenous Education Success Teacher and čερθ (sounds like 'chepth' - ?ay?ajuθəm for auntie/uncle) District Indigenous Culture & Student Support Workers. The overarching goal of the Indigenous Education department is to support the holistic success of Indigenous students through enriched experiences and opportunities.



STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES / DIVERSE ABILITIES

Students with disabilities and diverse abilities are supported by their PIE teacher and our Inclusive Education Department which includes a Director of Student Support Services, a Learning Support Coordinator, Learning Support Teachers (LSTs) and Education Assistants (EAs). With or without a Ministry-recognized designation, programs can be adapted to meet the needs of individual students. Students with a Ministry-recognized designation are provided with the opportunity to participate in the development of an Inclusive Education Plan (IEP).



Program Options



Home-based Learning

Parents work with a teacher, and frequently the student, to develop a Student Learning Plan (SLP) for each child; summarizing the teaching methods, resources, and activities designed to meet the specific grade level's learning standards. The administrators and/or the student's teacher will provide direction, advice, and assistance in this process. The parent and/or student will provide information about the student's interests, strengths, areas of need and learning preferences.



In-person Opportunities

Students participating in in-person opportunities also have individualized SLPs and learn at home most days. Additionally, they have opportunities to join other students and PIE staff for in-person learning and/or activities, depending on the focus of the in-person program.

Why Home-based Learning?

- Flexibility: students can learn where and when they want to
- Autonomy: students can show what they know in ways that are meaningful
- Engagement: students can focus on projects/areas of study they are interested in
- Time: students can go at their own pace when encountering skills they find challenging and/or those they perceive as easy




Why In-person Opportunities?

- Learn with other students: facilitate the development of friendships and build social-emotional skills
- Sense of belonging: build relationships with PIE community members and contribute to school culture
- Accountability: access strategies for building structure into the home-learning experience
