Program Format

Youth Train in Trades programs are generally developed and offered as partnerships between school districts and postsecondary institutions with classes being taught at the post secondary institution. After achieving first level technical training through a YTT foundational program, students looking for an apprenticeship will have a better chance of finding an employer sponsor.

How do students benefit?

- Youth Train in Trades allows students to start apprenticeship training in selected Canadian industry training programs.
- Students enrolled in a YTT program receive their postsecondary technical training tuition free of charge.
- Depending on the program choice, YTT Students can earn up to 48 high school credits and post-secondary institute credits.
- Upon successful completion of an YTT program, students receive credit for the first level of technical training from Skilled Trades BC

What is Youth Train in Trades (YTT)?

An apprenticeship involves about 80% of on-the-job or "work-based training" and 20% classroom or "technical training". YTT students are funded for first level of their technical training program, like automotive, welding or carpentry. YTT is "dual credit", meaning students earn both high school credits and technical training credit towards their first year in that trade. YTT compliments Youth Work in Trades, the work-based youth apprenticeship program.

Student Eligibility

- Students must be school age - 19 and under.
- Students must be registered for an approved YTT program prior to graduation.
- Students must meet college pre-requisites for technical training program entry.
- Students must have a transition plan detailing their path and career plan in that trade.
