English immersion assists International students in achieving high test scores to ensure university acceptance. BC Graduation - Brooks High School

International students enrolled in our academic programs are offered BC government curriculum courses along with a wide range of electives. The goals for students in this program are to earn a high school graduation diploma and prepare for entry into university or college.

British Columbia's High School Graduation diploma is recognized by all Canadian and U.S. universities as well as colleges and universities around the world. The popular BC Graduation and University Entrance Program prepares one hundred percent of Powell River's International student graduates to enroll in universities throughout Canada, the United States and around the world.

English & Canadian Culture

This program gives International students the chance to learn English quickly while experiencing Canadian culture. Students taking this cultural experience program must be dedicated to their studies, but are also encouraged to participate in Canadian recreational and cultural activities.

English Language Learner (ELL)

ELL or English Language Learner is available for all International students. Our unique English immersion program features outdoor excursions and a community awareness program which assists students in fully developing their knowledge of Canadian life while enhancing their proficiency in speaking English.

Dual Credit Academic University Courses

University Credit Courses available to Grade 11 and Grade 12 International students. Transferable University courses offered are Psychology, Human Services, Digital Film, Outdoor Tourism (Coast Mountain Academy) and Business Computer Applications.

Summer Eco-Adventure ESL Program and Summer High School Credit Program

The popular Summer Eco-Adventure Program accepts International students during July and August for outdoor recreation and fun. Camping, hiking, horseback riding, golfing, swimming, sailing and kayaking are outdoor activities enjoyed by our students. 4 week Summer ESL offers English instruction in classrooms and outdoors. 6 week Summer Credit Program offers Grade 10, Grade 11 and Grade 12 high school credit courses.



Support For Students

International students living in Powell River benefit from an established support program. A team of international student advisors is available to ease the strain of adapting to a new culture and language. The advisors assist in course selection, school work, university applications and counseling for students unfamiliar with any of the procedures. Extra tutoring in any academic subject can be arranged by the school counselor. Teachers are available to provide additional help after school.

Social events such as parties, dinners, sports competitions and recreational activities are arranged by program support staff along with an annual camping trip in June and trips to Vancouver, Nanaimo and Victoria.

Course Selection

After arrival, students will be assessed and placed in courses depending on their abilities. Among the academic courses leading to high school graduation are English, math, physics, chemistry, biology, geography, history, art, technology, etc. Please see Curriculum Guide at www.sd.47.bc.ca for a complete list of all credit courses.

HOW TO APPLY

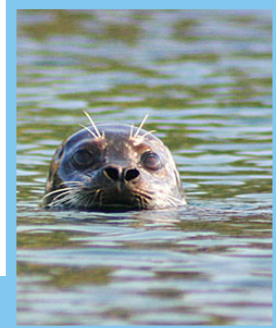
Obtain Student Application from Brin L. Bymin at brin.l.bymin@sd47.bc.ca Email completed Application Form along with copy of Passport and most recent School Transcripts to Director Brin L. Bymin at brin.l.bymin@sd47.bc.ca

Applications are reviewed immediately. Student applicants will receive notification of Acceptance or Rejection within 48 hours. Successful applicants will be billed for the tuition fee. Following payment, students will receive an official Receipt, Letter of Acceptance and Notarized Custodianship letter.

English Requirement - None. Students are assessed on an individual basis and placed in programs according to their needs, abilities and degree of motivation. English Language Learner (ELL) instruction is provided along with regular academic courses.

Academic Requirement - None. Student's academic goals, records of conduct and motivation are considered on a case-by-case assessment.

Successful applicants must:

Apply for Canadian Study Permit.

Submit Acceptance Letter and Notarized Custodianship Letter (along with Application to Study in Canada) to the nearest Canadian Immigration/Consulate Office or online.

Undergo a Medical Examination as required by Immigration Canada.

Allow 6 to 8 weeks for Immigration Canada to process the application.

Homestay Families

Students in the International Education Program participate in a mandatory homestay program. Homestay families provide students with the security of family and a cultural education in an environment which enables them to experience "true" Canadian living. We believe Homestay Families are the most important aspect of the program by providing enriching experiences that will last a lifetime!

ELL Homestay Program

The ELL Homestay program includes attention to the four main areas of communication in English; reading, writing, listening and speaking. The unique English Immersion program includes homestay and community focused activities for International students. Day trips away from school into the community to enjoy recreational experiences and to practice English language are an integral component of the ELL program.

Homestay Coordinator

Our homestay coordinator carefully screens and selects all Powell River homestay families in order to ensure International students are placed in safe, comfortable, welcoming homes. The full time coordinator is available to assist all students seven days a week.

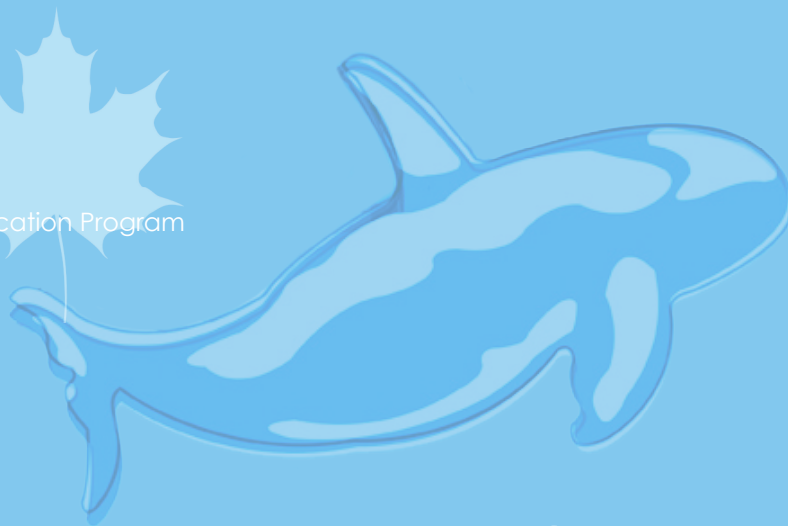
