<u>**titgenəm**</u> - Big voice - (tit-qwenum)

Part of teaching children is helping them find their <u>titqenəm</u>. This can be difficult as kids grow up. A <u>titqenəm</u> is more than just the words that come out of our mouth, but also our willingness to speak truth to those around us. As kids begin to explore their voice sometimes it comes out too big and it can be aggressive or angry. Other times it might be small and either not come out, or not come across in a way that truly advocates for their needs. Finding our <u>titqenəm</u> is a process that can take a life time to get it right. Regardless of how long it takes it is important that we find that balance. My hope is that children at Henderson Elementary not only find their <u>titqenəm</u> in advocating for themselves, but also that they find their <u>titqenəm</u> in advocating for those around them. Their friends at school, as well as people in our small community, and around the globe, who may not have a voice of their own. EDAS is a project that helps us accomplish just that. Fox: A Circle of Life Story

This non-fiction picture book, with simple, poetic language and engaging, colourful collage-style visuals, tells the story of a mother fox seeking prey to feed her three cubs.
