yex̣atasoṭ Remembered - (yah ha tashol)

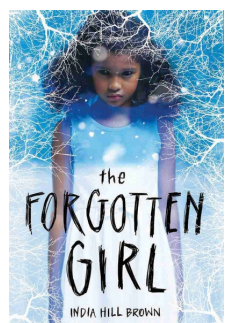
