tiyhEgən mEtəm Integrity - (tee hegun metum)

On Friday we held our first recognition assembly and introduced our ta?aw for the month of October. Our word is tiyhtegen metem which means integrity. During the assembly I spoke to students about the importance of being whole. We spoke about how times in our lives we may find ourselves "out of integrity" with those around us either by our intentional or unintentional actions. We spoke about 4 specific ways that we stay in integrity. First, we keep promises, when we tell people people that we will do something we follow through with that promise. Second, we apologize when we cause harm to others. These actions are not always intentional. Sometimes we harm those with no intent to do so. When we do this we have to seek ways to make amends. Third, we speak our truth in a safe and caring way. The adage that sticks and stones will break our bones but words will never hurt me have a nice rhyme, however, there are many times when our "truth" hurts others.
