- If a student moves to a different school district, independent school, or different audiology clinic, a new Permission to Share consent form, signed by parent/ legal guardian is required. If there are multiple audiology clinics involved, please ensure they are all listed on the form.
- Please replace tubes and domes for Roger Focus receivers at least every 3 months to ensure optimal functioning. A set of tubes and domes are included with the initial loan. Replacements can be requested from the public health audiology clinic.
- When using the Roger Installer, please make sure any hearing aids or CI processors within 3 metres are turned off, including personal hearing aids and processors.
- Auditory Outreach offers in-person consultation/ assessment from SLP, TDHH, and audiologist available for students with cochlear implants and their school teams. Referral forms and process can be found on our website: [Cochlear Implant Services](#)
