

You don't need to be a master storyteller to delight your child with a story.

- Try telling a personal meaningful story or something funny from your own childhood.
- Tell your child a story about themselves, like the story of their birth and how much you were looking forward to meeting them, or things they loved when they were little.
- Share about their culture and family members who were important to you.

Involve your child in the story through questions like, "What do you think happened next?" or "How do you think that felt?".

It's okay for children to interrupt stories and ask questions. There's no right or wrong way, and this supports the development of self-esteem. **Just relax, have fun, and go with the flow!**







# **SPINNING ART WITH THE FAMILY**

### >>> SALAD SPINNER SPIN ART INSTRUCTIONS:

- 1. Open the salad spinner.
- 2. Put the cut paper or coffee filter inside the salad spinner.
- 3. Squirt paint onto the coffee filter/paper (It works best if you squirt it in several spots inside of the coffee filter instead of just in the center).
- 4. Close the lid.
- 5. Spin for a few minutes.
- 6. Open it and see how it looks. If it needs more colors, squeeze more paint, put the lid on and spin some more.
- 7. Remove it from the salad spinner and lay it out to dry.
- 8. Repeat!

For a little extra fun mix it up with light and heavy objects, rocks, leaves

## SPINNING AROUND WITH OUR FAMILY At the neighborhood park

Have you ever noticed your child enjoying activities like spinning around until they're dizzy, rolling down a hill, spinning wheels on toy cars, or watching balls roll down a ramp? These activities are part of what's called "rotational play" or a "rotational schema." This type of play helps build your child's spatial awareness, balance, and coordination. Schemas are repeated patterns of action, behavior or play that help children understand the world around them.

#### >>> TIPS TO ENJOY ROTATIONAL PLAY SAFELY AND EFFECTIVELY

- **Start Slow:** (depending on your child) Help guide your child to hold on to the equipment. Begin by asking your child, "Would you like me to spin you once or twice?" This encourages them to use their words to express what they want.
- **Engage and Observe:** Slowly spin your child and stop to make eye contact, asking if they would like to be spun again. This helps them feel secure and understood and also creates space for them to use their language and communication skills.
- Language Development: Once your child gets the hang of spinning, use this opportunity to practice their language skills. Ask them how many spins they would like. You can also use this as an opportunity to count together!
- Remember, it's important to ask for your child's consent before engaging in any play activity. Always check if they are comfortable and willing to participate.

#### THINGS TO KNOW BEFORE YOU START:

o What is <u>MyEd</u>? The MyEd BC Student Family Portal is another way in which students and their family can access information about their educational program. If you do not have a MyEd account yet, please note that you MUST be on a laptop, computer, or iPad to create one. You cannot create an account on your phone.

o Your first choice on MyEd must be your catchment area school. Please refer to this **<u>Catchment Area Boundaries page</u>** to determine your child's school.

o Your second choice on MyEd is your desired school, which can be indicated in the Comment field on the 'Submit Tab' (final step before submitting application on MyEd).

• Please note: Students who attend a school outside of their catchment area are not eligible for transportation or transportation assistance.

The district is hosting a **Kindergarten Registration** event at Edgehill Elementary (for all families, not just Edgehill catchment families) on **February 25th at 3pm-6pm** in the library if they would like to learn more, ask any questions, get support with registration.
